# How do I get help?

<u>findhelpidaho.org</u> exists to make the process of getting help simple and quick. It's free to search and connect to programs and services on <u>findhelpidaho.org</u>. Searching is zip code based and can be done completely anonymously. All services listed are free or reduced-cost. Visit <u>findhelpidaho.org</u> to see how easy connecting to free and reduced-cost programs can be!

### Is findhelpidaho.org private?

All the information on <u>findhelpidaho.org</u> is HIPAA and FERPA compliant, and Hi-Trust Certified. The full data and security policy can be view here: <u>Data & Security</u>.

### Is findhelpidaho.org accessible?

<u>findhelpidaho.org</u> is specifically designed to meet the needs of the end-users and is verified through ongoing review and onsite visits with the users of the tools. The platform is compliant with national standards for accessibility (WCAG 2AA compliant) and can be immediately translated into 100+ languages using the Google Translate feature.

# Why can't I find the program I was looking for?

All programs in findhelpidaho.org must be free or reduced-cost to be listed. We also only show programs in the areas where they provide service. If you do not see a program that fits the above criteria, use our <u>Suggest a</u> <u>Program</u> tool to submit a new program!

#### How does findhelpidaho.org support community-based organizations?

<u>findhelpidaho.org</u> allows organizations that have <u>claimed</u> their program listings to receive and manage referrals the site, build custom screening questionnaires, and access data analytics reflect service delivery and needs in the community. Our tools are designed to help Organizations manage their workflows and serve clients more efficiently. #### What does the check mark on the program mean?

The claimed badge is a marker <u>findhelpidaho.org</u> uses on program cards to indicate a program has been <u>claimed</u>. Claiming means:

- 1. Information associated with the program has been reviewed for accuracy by someone who works for the organization that administers the program.
- 2. Providers have access to continually update their program information.
